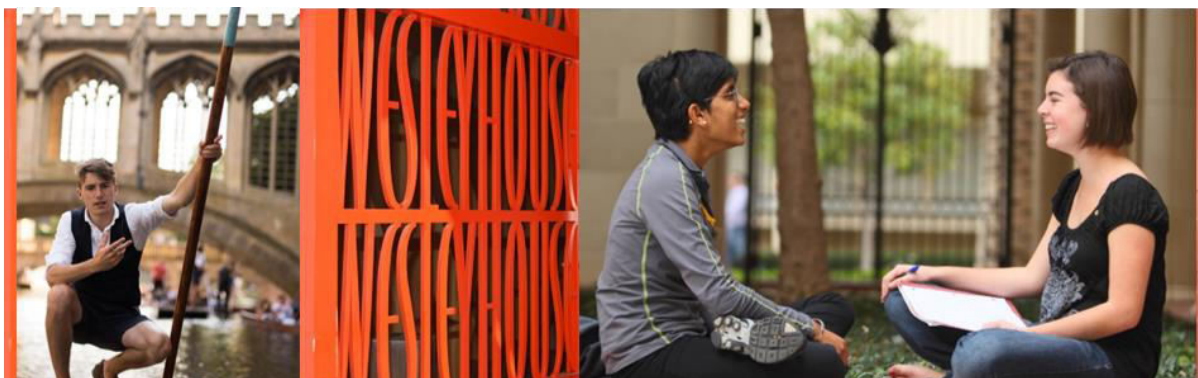


Courageous conversations

Dates

30th June-6th July 2020 (7 nights in Cambridge)

Costs:

- Cost per person (based on 20 participants) for 7 program days: \$2400 per person (including accommodation, most meals, teaching, educational trips).
- Costs include a free place for visiting GBHEM staff person.

Costs exclude flights, travel to/from airport, optional cultural activities e.g. punting on the river, outdoor theatre, additional trips e.g. to London (1 hour away by train).
